- Lockers- who decides for new schools and what is criteria? Will the new JHS have them? (Rick checking)

- Melissa said Riverview and Northshore districts don't carry netbooks back/forth. They checkout
- Rick mentioned we are adding 1:1 for 5th graders in the district but they won't be going home w/students
- When is next RFP? Are parents involved in that process?
- Which mandatory functions still not browser based? (testing?)
- Have we ever surveyed our students/families to understand usage and satisfaction?
- Many questions around technology decisions Rick offered to discuss with Sally, Janis and Melissa will create a list of questions and also think about the survey idea.

Discussed ideas around where there are logical places to infuse backpack related messages into training/messaging that already exists: teacher training, administer communications 2x/mo w/ staff, monthly doc to staff, Aug/Sept annual training, new teacher training and 1st year training. Rick will chat with Stephen Bryant, Dir of Professional Learning, to see what might make sense.
